FOREWORD

Wars, battles, or skirmishes were engaged in by native Americans and settlers interested in sharing the same landscape for much of the four hundred years, ending with the first decade of this century. Treaties were a matter of convenience. Then, as now, the military served as an instrument of policy.

This number, in our irregularly issued bibliography series, presents book and periodical article citations written about the major conflicts. They provide details which relate to terrorist activities as there was seldom a prescribed field of battle and little time to organize for tactics. The citations are followed by a chronological items index which is keyed to the book or article. Finally, there is a list of Regular Army National Guard combat units which are authorized US Army flag streamers. Years of specific citation are indicated if identified in the lineage sources.
